

## Pharmacy

Prerequisites for admission into the Doctor of Pharmacy degree program include a bachelor's degree. Consequently, students who come to VCU from a Virginia Community College or Richard Bland College should declare an academic major while also indicating a pre-pharmacy advising track. As part of the bachelor's degree required for admission, the following prerequisite courses are necessary for admission to the Doctor of Pharmacy Program.
